Artist Profiles

KEITH CLARK. ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Co-Founder of Portland SummerFest and the Astoria Music Festival, Keith Clark is internationally active as conductor, composer, and recording artist. He was awarded the prestigious American Prize for Artistic Excellence in Opera conducting for the Pacific Northwest premiere of Alban Berg's *Wozzeck* in the Astoria Music Festival.

In Russia, he was named Principal Guest Conductor of the Siberian State Philharmonic and a Producing Director at the Globus Theater in Novosibirsk, where he led the prize-winning Russian premiere of *West Side Story*. In Salzburg, he led annual productions of Mozart operas with the Amadeus Opera Ensemble, and his festivals appearances include Vienna, Bucharest, Siena, Los Angeles, and Switzerland. He received his PhD from UCLA, a Fulbright Fellowship to the Vienna Music Academy, diplomas from the Chigiana Music Academy in Italy, and served as assistant to Zubin Mehta, Seiji Ozawa, and Leonard Bernstein. Following over a decade abroad, he returned to California to found the Pacific Symphony Orchestra, building it into America's fastest growing professional orchestra. He is featured on over 40 recordings. Ranging from Baroque music to Schoenberg's *Gurrelieder*, his CDs have received Grammy nominations, "Record of the Year" and "Classical Hall of Fame" awards, and Billboard Bestseller listings. In London, his orchestral recording of Debussy's *Clair de Lune* was named "Number One on the People's Classical Chart" as "the world's most listened-to classical music track."

ANGELA MEADE, SOPRANO

Hailed as "the most talked about soprano of her generation" (Opera News), American soprano Angela Meade is the winner of both the Richard Tucker Award and the Metropolitan Opera's Beverly Sills Artist Award. Since her professional debut at the Metropolitan Opera as "Elvira" in Verdi's Ernani in 2008, she has been recognized as one of the outstanding vocalists of her generation. Highlights of the 2019/20 season include Meade's role and house debut as "Aïda" at Barcelona's historic Gran Teatre del Liceu; a house debut at Teatro di San Carlo in Naples Italy for Rossini's Ermione and a return later in the season for her much-lauded interpretation of Bellini's Norma; a role debut in Coruña Spain as "Elisabetta" in Don Carlo; a house debut at Teatro Massimo in Palermo Italy as "Imogene" in Bellini's Il Pirata and a return to ABAO in Bilbao for the title role of Donizetti's Anna Bolena. On the concert stage, Meade debuts with the Rossini Opera Festival in Pesaro, Italy for both a recital and their annual gala where she will sing excerpts from both Ermione and Guillaume Tell and a debut with the Elbphilharmonie for her acclaimed interpretation of Verdi's Requiem under the baton of Alan Gilbert. Angela Meade is a Washington State native and alumnus of the Academy of Vocal Arts. This is her sixth appearance at Opera in the Park. Comprehensive information is available at www.angelameade.com.

Angela Meade and husband, tenor Jon Matthew Myers, were married by Supreme Court Justice and opera enthusiast Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

ALLAN GLASSMAN, TENOR

Thrilling audiences throughout America and Europe for decades with his vibrant timbre and committed interpretations of roles, critics exclaim "his very presence on stage made those around him sound better." Hailed as the "Otello" of his generation: "Glassman is a full-on Verdian tenor... Glassman is more than equal to the demands of the role, conveying Otello's pain and suspicion vividly." A regular at The Metropolitan Opera, Mr. Glassman triumphed as Herod in a production of Salome and has since been heard in The Met's productions of Billy Budd as "Red Whiskers"; Die Frau ohne Schatten as "The Hunchback Brother"; Salome as the "First Jew"; Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk District as "The Shabby Peasant"; and in productions of Boris Godunov, The Great Gatsby, Carmen, Elektra, Kát'a Kabanová, The Ghost of Versailles, Mussorgsky's Khovanshchina, and Wozzeck. International performances include "Manrico" in Verdi's Il trovatore with the Deutsche Oper Berlin; "Samson" in Samson et Dalila at the New Israeli Opera in Tel Aviv; "The Prince" in Rusalka in the Czech Republic; title role in Verdi's Ernani, "Don José" in Carmen, and I vespri siciliani with L'Opéra de Nice; I vespri siciliani with Den Norske Opera; Carmen with Opera Valencia in Spain; "The Prince" in Rusalka with Oper Frankfurt, and "Cavaradossi" in Tosca at the Belleayre Music Festival. RICHARD ZELLER, BARITONE

Since making his Metropolitan Opera debut in 1989, Baritone Richard Zeller has appeared for 11 seasons at the Met in such leading roles as "Marcello" in Puccini's *La bohème*, "Ernesto" in Bellini's *Il Pirata*, "Eddie" in Bolcom's *A View from the Bridge*, "Coroebus" in Berlioz's *Les Troyens*, and "Enrico" in Donizetti's *Lucia di Lammermoor*. He has also appeared in numerous operas with Chicago Lyric Opera, Berlin Staatsoper, Deutsche Oper am Rhein, Edinburgh Festival, Vienna Festival, and many others in the US, Europe, and Asia. A frequent concert artist, Zeller has sung with the Chicago Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, Philadelphia Orchestra, Boston Symphony, and other orchestras and opera companies in more than 1200 performances. FUN FACT:

GIUSEPPE VERDI (1813–1901)

Verdi was one of the world's greatest operatic composers. His instincts for melody and thrilling drama have ensured the enduring popularity of many of his 28 operas. Three of his operas (La Traviata, Rigoletto, and Aida) are consistently performed 300 to 400 times a year worldwide. But a further six of his 23 operas commonly reach 100 performances a year — Nabucco, Macbeth, Trovatore, Un ballo in maschera, Don Carlos, Otello, and Falstaff.

He is a national hero in Italy. Born alongside Italy's press for nationhood, Verdi's operas provided Italians with the music that expressed the passion for their cause and became an important part of Italy's national identity. "Va, pensiero" (Chorus of the Hebrew Slaves) from Nabucco, helped unify the population in 1842 at the time it was written, and has become Italy's second, unofficial, national anthem. His funeral was attended by more people (300,000) than any event in the history of Italy.

JOCELYN CLAIRE THOMAS

JOCELYN CLAIRE THOMAS, a versatile soprano praised for her haunting sound and musical intelligence, is a frequent performer in opera, concert, and recital.

Tenor SCOT CRANDAL's singing has been described by critics as "powerful and passionate". He has appeared as soloist throughout the northwest, including Portland Opera, Bravo Chorale, Oregon Chorale, Opera Theatre Oregon, and Choral Arts Ensemble. DAN GIBBS, Baritone, is an Oregon native who received his B.A. in Vocal Performance from Southern Oregon University. He currently teaches and performs in Beaverton, Hillsboro, and Portland.

ZACHARY LENOX, a broad, resonant baritone that is exquisitely controlled throughout his entire range, is a frequent performer of opera, concert, and art song up and down the west coast.teaches and performs in Beaverton, Hillsboro, and Portland.

PAUL SADILEK, Bass, a Portland native, has appeared as a soloist with numerous groups, including the Oregon Symphony, Portland Columbia Symphony, Portland Baroque Orchestra, Opera Theater Oregon, Bach Cantata Choir and Oregon Repertory Singers.
